Competitions are an important part of your law degree. Not only do they help you develop the skills you will need for future career opportunities, they also get you involved with other law students and personalities from the legal community. They are a great way to gain knowledge of the practical skills that are a part of practicing law.

Each tests different skills and abilities to help build your experience for moving into the legal industry. But you don't need to choose just one - register to compete in any you find interesting.

Mooting

Witness Examination

A moot is a simulated appeal in a superior court, based on a mock fact scenario and judgment from a lower court. Mooting competitions provide students the opportunity to test their problem solving, written, oral, and legal research skills.

What to expect?

Competitors should expect to be queried and questioned by the judges, and assessed on how well you understand the facts and the cases surrounding that particular area of law. Witness Examination is a simulated civil or criminal trial. The trial is run from the opening statement through the examination of witnesses to the closing addresses.

What to expect?

The witness examination competition is а challenging competition that tests your ability to think quickly. This competition requires students to prepare and opening present an statement. examinationin-chief, crossexamination and closing statement.



Negotiations

For diplomats - or those who think that their diplomacy skills could use some polishing! Either way, negotiation competition gives students the chance to hone their skills at the negotiating table.

What to expect?

Two teams, each of two solicitors, meet to discuss a dispute between their clients. Each team is provided with a description of the fact scenario. Some facts are known to both teams, but each team has some secrets too. Each team is also armed with instructions from their client detailing exactly what outcome they should seek – and what should be avoided at all costs.

The negotiation itself can last for up to an hour, after which each team is given a chance to review their own performance before a winner is picked. The winner is not necessarily the team that walks away with the better deal, but the one which gets closest to their client's wishes.





Client Interview

The ability to interview a client effectively is one of the most important skills a solicitor must possess. When representing a client it is vital to ensure that you have all the relevant details and the first few consultations with your new client will provide you with the foundation for vour lawyer/client professional relationship.

What to expect?

Each team of two has a set amount of time to ascertain all information necessary to allow you to represent your client effectively and then some time will be set aside for you to reflect on your interview.

Competitors must cover all the formalities of an interview, take note of the personal details of the client, the intricacies of the problem and suggest possible courses of action.
